THE BEST BROWNIE RECIPE EVER

A hunger freshly made.



When I was about 10 years old, my grandmother asked me to help her make brownies from a new recipe she discovered. Naturally, I happily accepted her request. She never, ever made anything from a mix. Her brownies were made from scratch. As she measured out the flour and other ingredients listed on the recipe for the brownies, she told me to work on the frosting. This was different from other frostings. I had to beat powdered sugar into butter. This was hard since we had no automatic machines for beating. When the brownies had finished baking in the oven, my grandmother set them aside to cool because you sure don't want to spread butter frosting on hot brownies because the brownies could melt the butter. Once the brownies were cool enough, I was told to spread the butter frosting thinly over them. Meanwhile my grandmother had melted bitter-sweet chocolate in a double boiler. We had to wait for that to really cool to prevent melting of the butter part of the frosting. This was the most fun part of my helping: slowly dripping melted chocolate over the frosted brownies, then carefully spreading the melted chocolate around the brownies. Why was this the most fun part? I got to lick the spoon I used for dripping the chocolate over the brownies, plus I got to lick the knife I used for evenly spreading the chocolate.

The brownies were made in a pan that was 9 inches by 9 inches. When they were fully frosted, we were supposed to put them in the fridge to harden the melted chocolate quickly, but my grandmother thought we should sample them first. We each had a small piece. Boy, were they good! We decided to have another sample. Then another, and another. By the time my grandfather got tempted by the chocolate smell to leave his workshop in the garage, we had devoured the whole pan of brownies. We apologized to him, and I hope we looked sincerely repentant. Actually, we weren't able to eat a single bite of anything for lunch, and supper for us was a few small bites. The following week I asked her when we were going to make those brownies again. Never, she said, because you know we won't have any self-control this time either. That was too bad, because none of the other brownies she ever made came up to the yumminess of those forbidden brownies!
