THE GATHERING TIME

There comes a time in the fall when you awaken and you know in your bones that it's begun, the gathering time.

Fall has always been my favorite time of the year as far back as I can remember. I always refer to it as "the gathering time", the time we would be gathering the last remnants of the vegetable garden, putting potatoes, carrots, turnips, and beets in bins of sand in the old root cellar with even a hole lined with straw to layer in the watermelons.

It was a time for butchering, usually a couple of pigs and a beef cow. I won't go into this process, since it is a whole memoir in itself.

The hay was all stacked in the barn for the oncoming winter. The wood would be gathered, thin split, and stacked to ensure a toasty night during the long winter ahead.

Leaves were gathered and put around the foundation of the house, this being called "Yankee Insulation". In later years when the sills had to be replaced because the leaves had caused rotting there were a few choice words said, as in "What were they thinking?"

I knew that any day now my mother would make a great show of sniffing the air and saying,"Do you smell the burning leaves, a touch of frost? Smells like fruit cake weather to me!"

To other people around the planet this sentence of my mother's probably wouldn't mean very much, but as a child I felt excitement from my head right down to my toes. It meant the beginning of holiday preparations, Thanksgiving, Christmas, oh my!

The first thing I knew we would do was to go walking through our woods until we came upon an old Colonial road lined with hickory trees. It was here that we gathered nuts for the scrumptious fruitcakes that my mother would put together after we had gathered all the ingredients.

I remember that there was always a drying-out process for the nuts, to make sure they were no longer green. After they had dried came my father's job. Sitting around the kitchen, he would have a chunk of wood and a hammer and always bragged about his skills in retrieving a whole nut from its shell. At this time my mother started candying orange peals and lemon peals that would go into the fruitcake. Pineapple and last fall's cherries had also been candied.

The only two ingredients that had to be bought in a store were the cheesecloth and a bottle of brandy. The cheesecloth was needed to wrap the finished fruitcakes in, and the brandy was for moistening them at intervals.

Today's young homemaker doesn't have any idea of such a procedure as she gaily throws ingredients into her basket at Walmart. Yet as an old timer I smile and realize that this young mother is making memories for her little ones, perhaps in a different way, but their memories will be just as cherished as the ones my mother gave to me so long ago.
